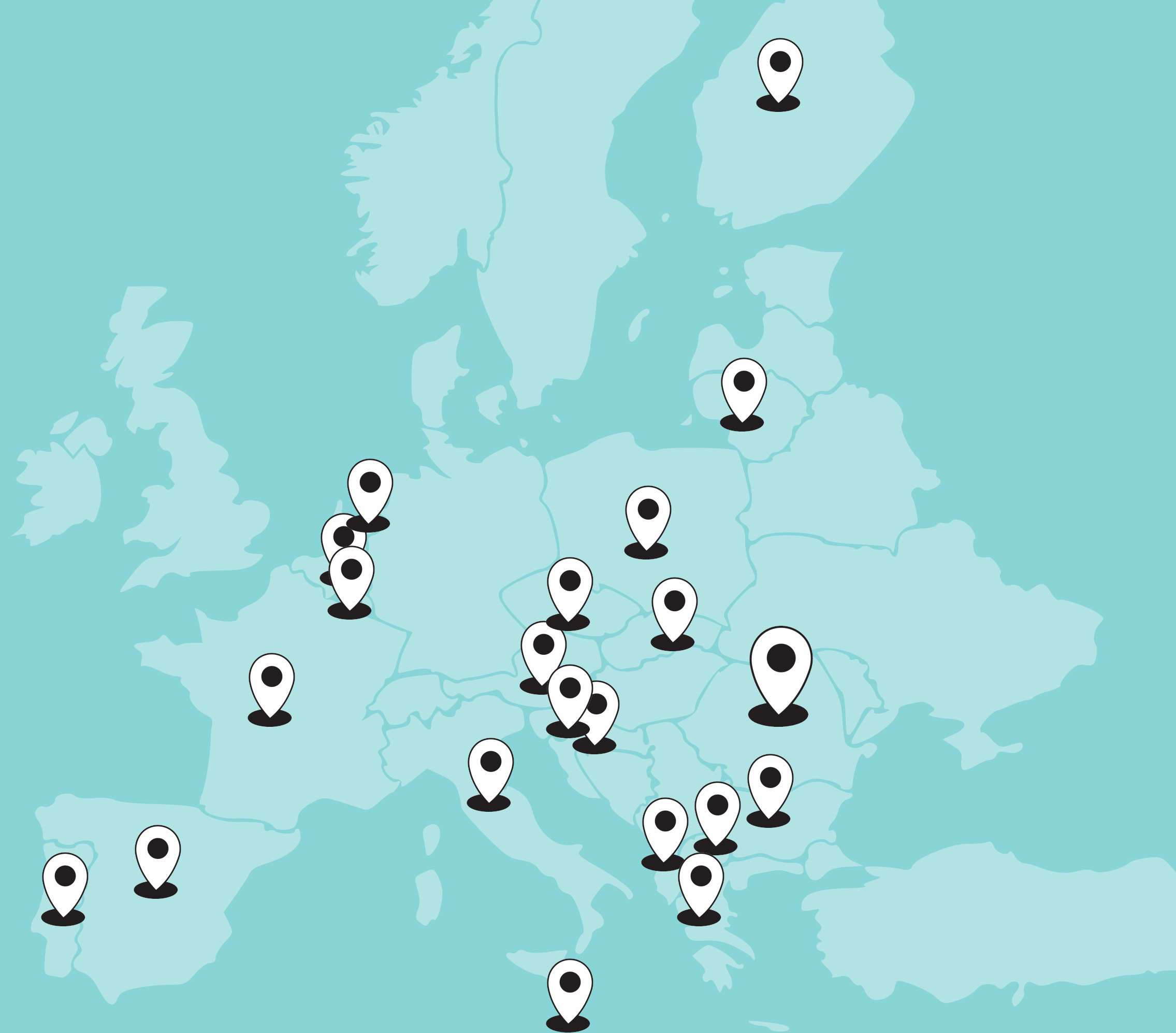

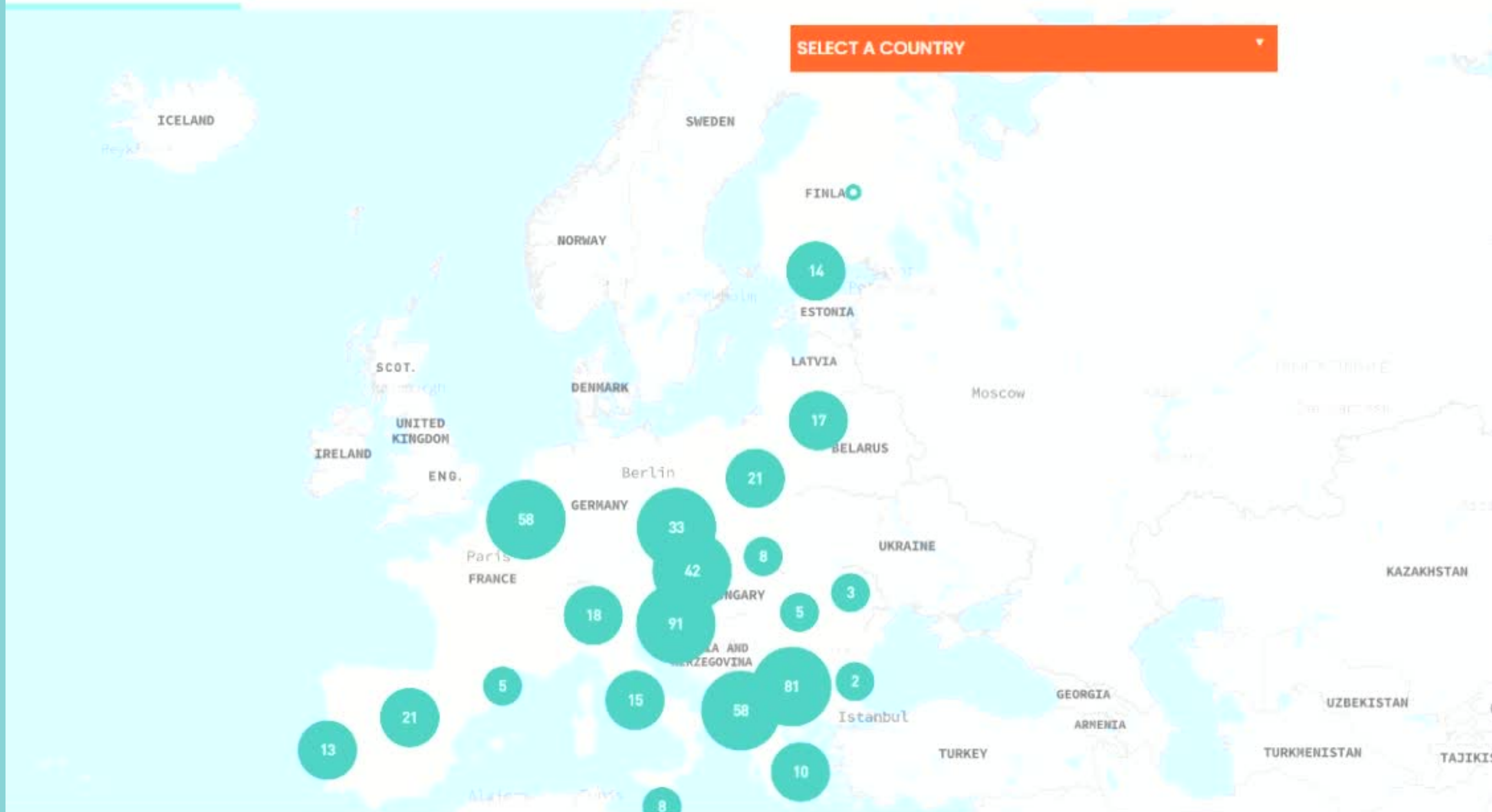
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MAP OF CIVIC EDUCATION IN EUROPE

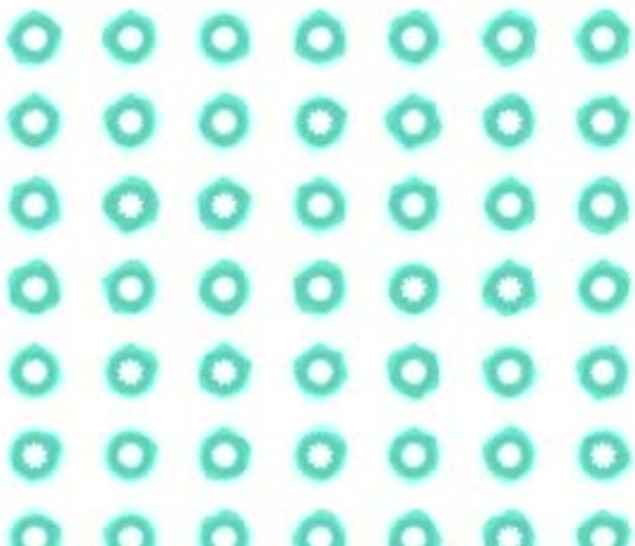

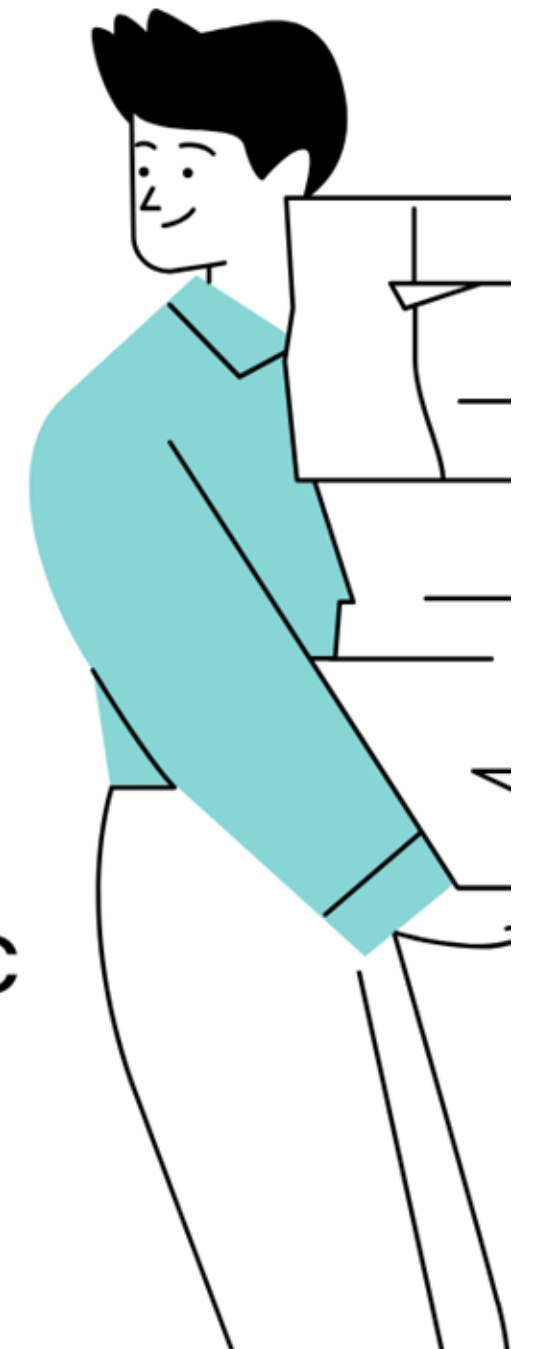

March 2021 – March 2023

- Flagship programme of THE CIVICS
- Identifying the main actors of civic education in 21 countries in Europe, in non-formal and informal CE
- Conducted in partnership with 22 local partners
- Supported by the German Federal Agency for Civic Education (Bundeszentrale für politische Bildung/bpb)

2800 civic educators in 21 countries

434 responses in total

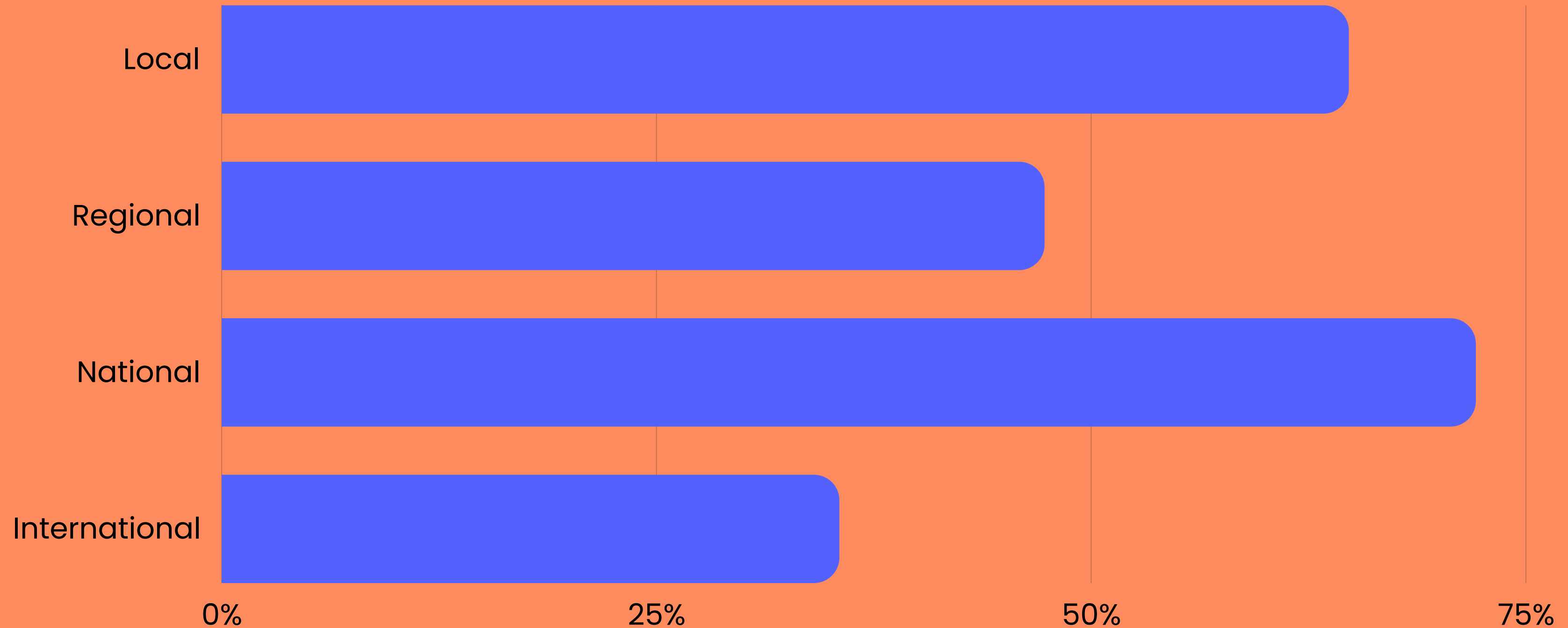

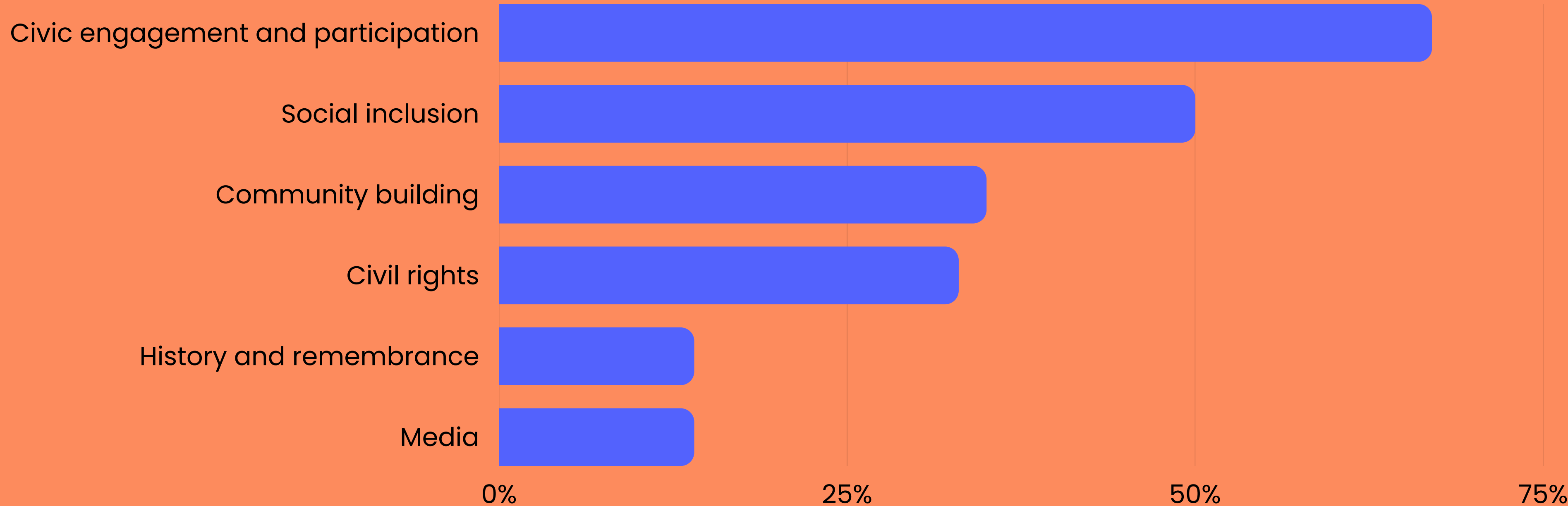

Where are your activities mostly taking place?

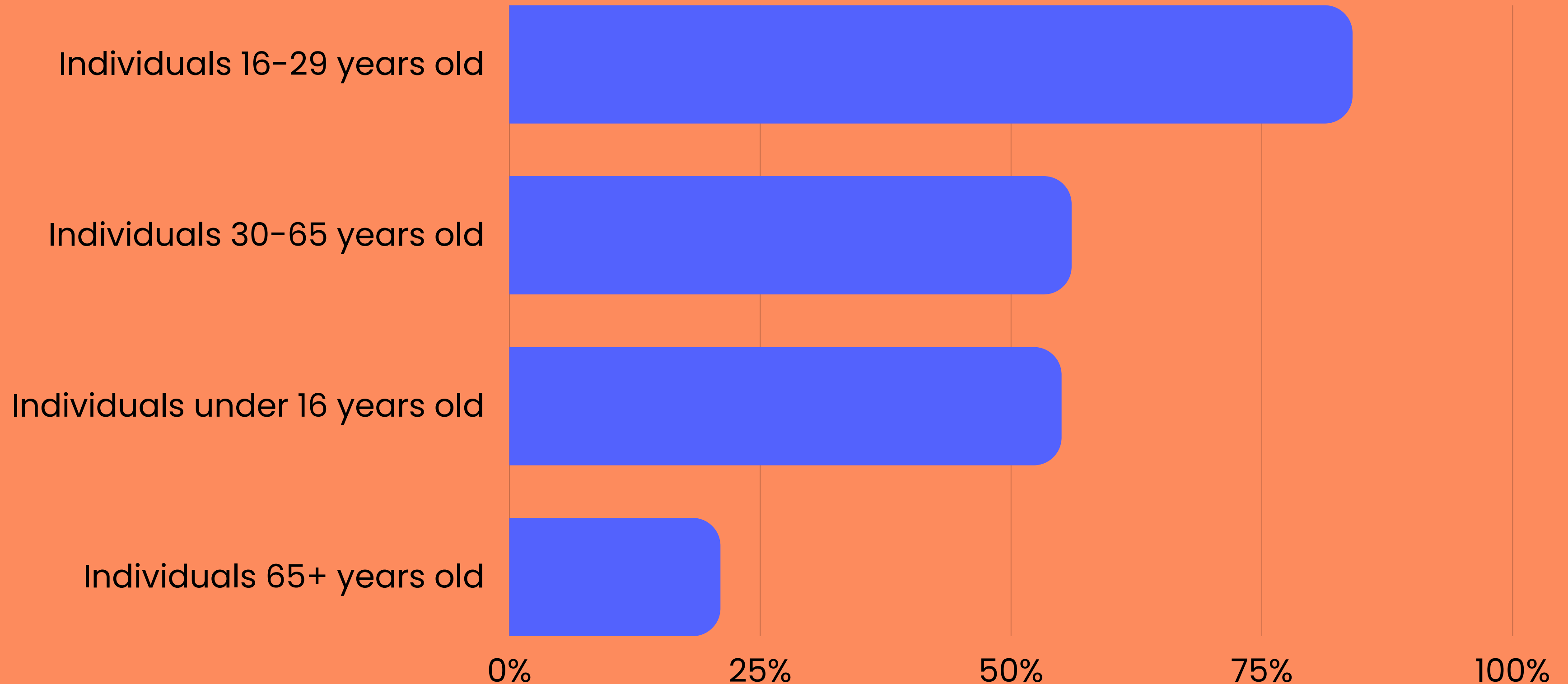

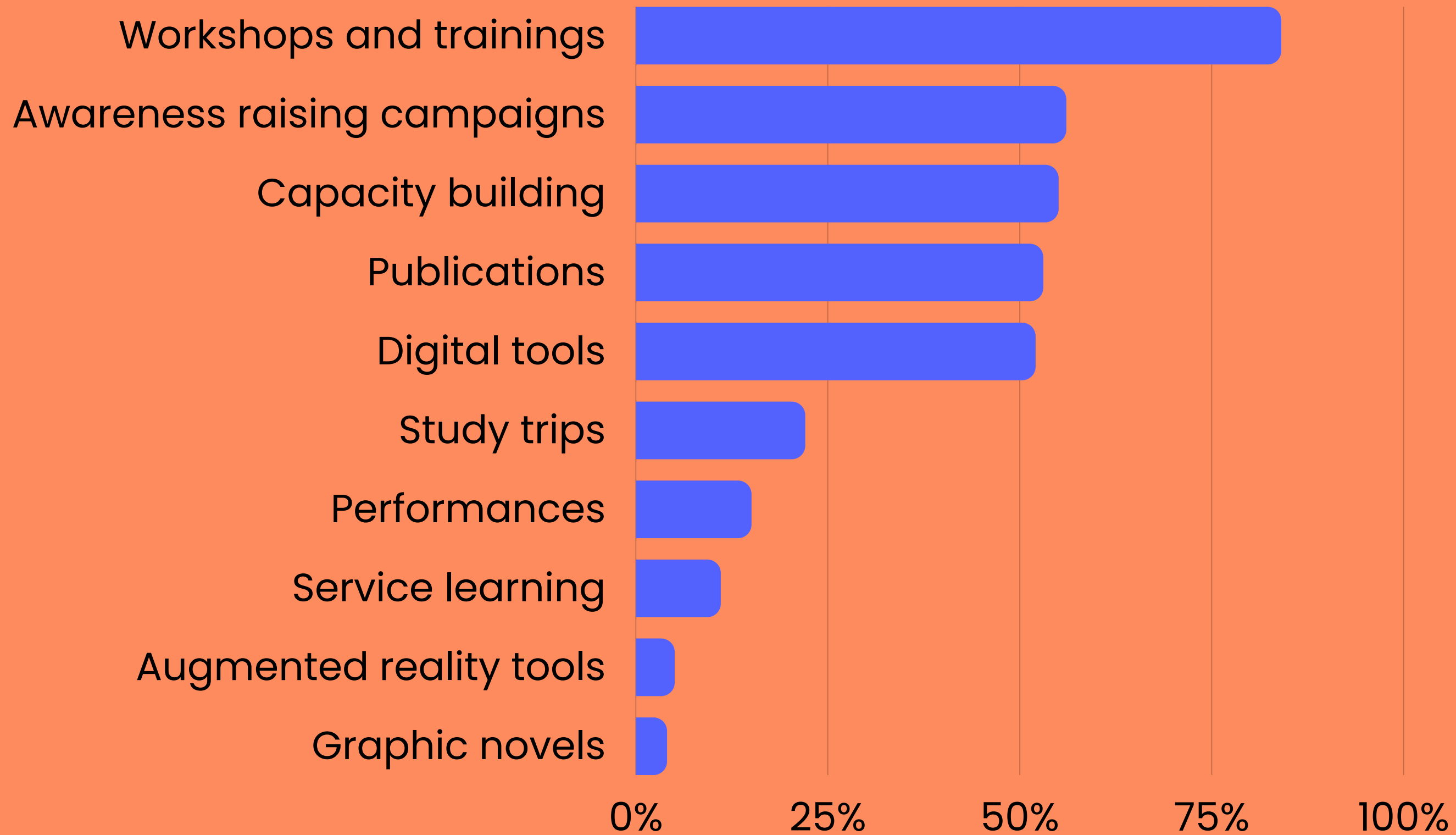
What is your main field of work?

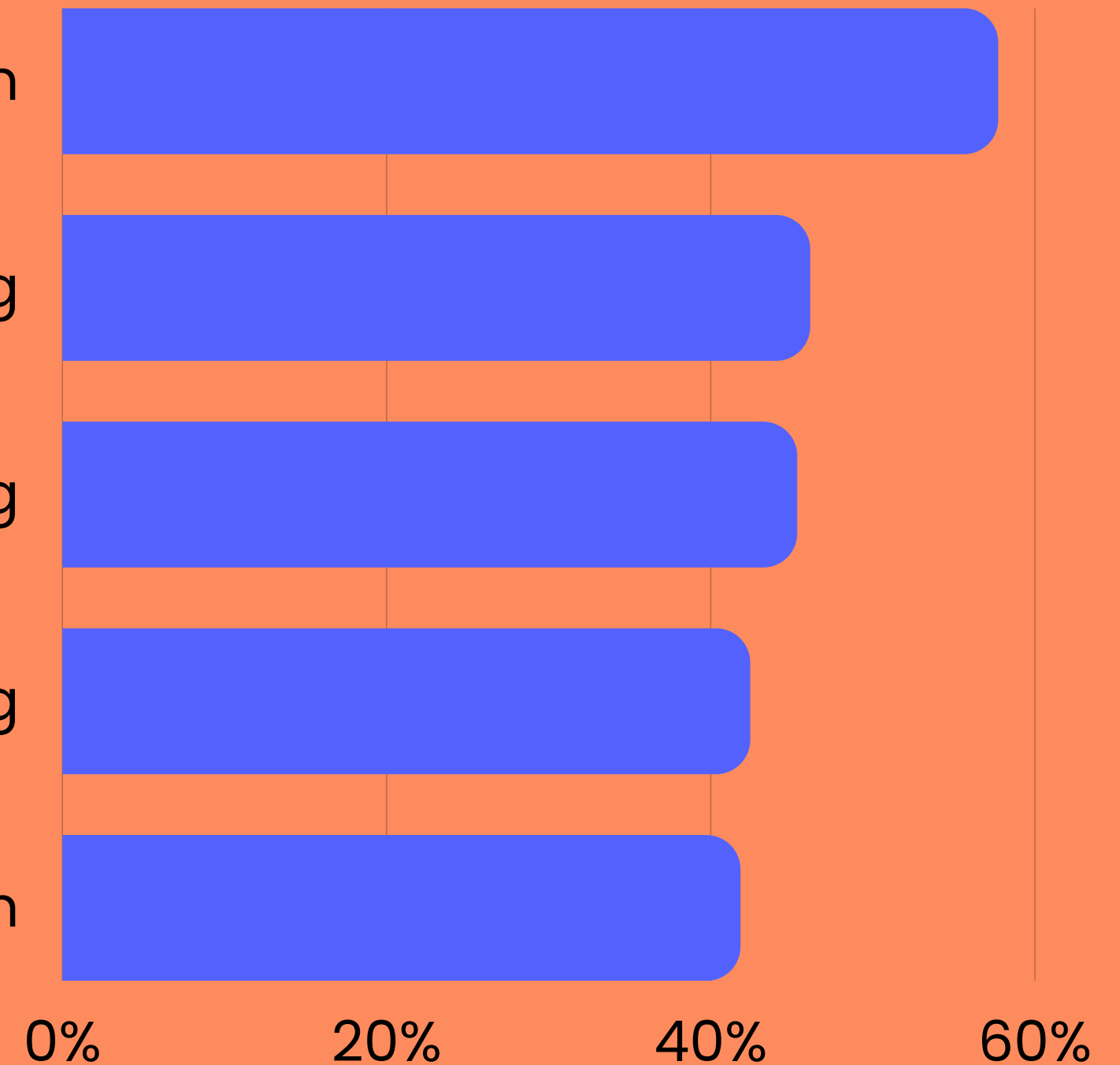

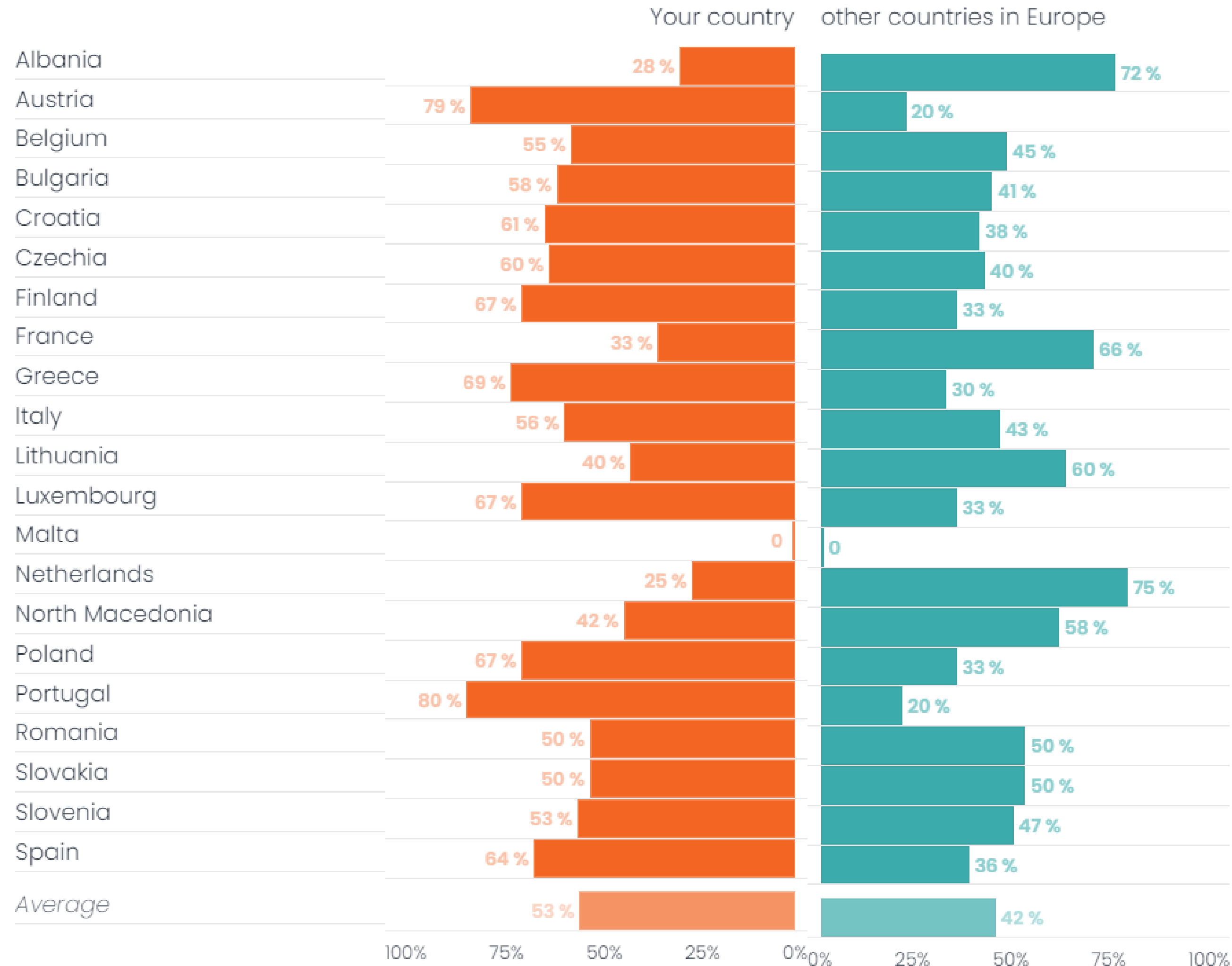

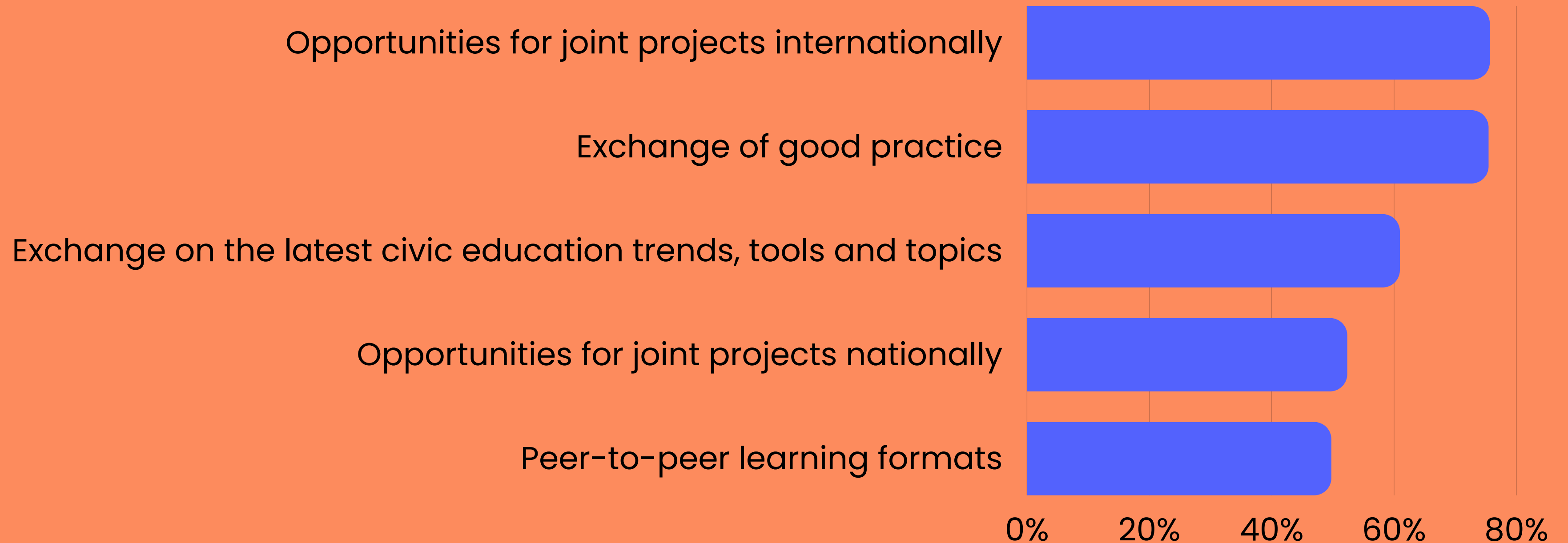
